Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the above referenced project pursuant to SDCL 1-19A-11.1. The South Dakota Office of the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) would like to provide the following comments concerning the effect of the proposed project on the non-renewable cultural resources of South Dakota.

On June 26, 2026, the SHPO received notification of the above-referenced project located at 414 9th Ave in Brookings, South Dakota. The proposed project involves relocating the structure located at 414 9th Avenue to 1008 3rd Street in Brookings, South Dakota. This would move the property out of the Brookings Central Residential Historic District. This property is contributing to the Brookings Central Residential Historic, which is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. SDCL 1-19A-11.1 outlines a specific process that must be followed prior to any governmental action that may harm any historic property that is included in the National or State Registers of Historic Places.

Based upon the information provided, the proposed project has the potential to encroach upon, damage or destroy historic property that is included in the National Register of Historic Places or the State Register of Historic Places. Specifically, the removal of the property has the potential to damage the historic district and will remove the 414 9th Avenue from listing on the National Register of Historic Places and the State Register of Historic Places.

Therefore, the SHPO is requesting an abbreviated case report regarding any feasible and prudent alternatives consisting of items 1, 2, 3, 5, 7 and 10. For item #10, please have the Brookings Historic Preservation Commission review and comment on the abbreviated case report within 180 days of receipt prior to submittal to SHPO.
