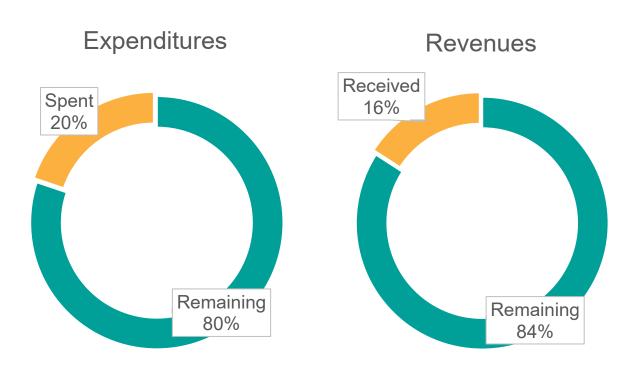
#### **Sales Tax Revenues**

- Q1 Revenue: \$5.37 million
  - ► 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Penny: \$2.5 million each
    - \$329k each above budget, up \$289k each YoY
  - ► 3B: \$298,000
    - \$26k above budget, up \$6,200 YoY
  - ► BID: \$49,400
    - \$2,600 below budget, up \$852 YoY
- Strong first quarter overall
- More modest growth in 3B and BID, continuing into Q2



### 1Q Budget to Actuals - General Fund

- Amended Expenditure Budget: \$23.7 million
  - Expenditures to Date: \$4.7 million
    - **20%**
  - Remaining Balance: \$19 million
- Amended Revenue Budget:
   \$21.4 million
  - ► Revenues to Date: \$3.4 million
    - **16%**
  - ► Remaining Balance: \$18 million

#### South Dakota Economic Outlook

- Strong Employment Growth and rising incomes
  - Strong economy attracting new workers/residents from across the country
- Housing Market Trends
  - Surpassing surrounding states
  - Prices showing signs of stabilizing
- Midwest Consumer Price Index
  - Continues to hold steady at 2.8%
- Consumer spending on discretionary items is cooling
  - ► Indicated by modest 3B and BID revenues
  - Same trends at the state level
