Subject: Ordinance 25-020: Conditional Use Permit – Major Home

Occupation Hair Salon – 1214 Western Avenue

Summary and Recommended Action:

Andrew Austreim has applied for a Conditional Use Permit to operate a home hair salon, a Major Home Occupation in a residential district. The Planning Commission voted 9-0 recommending approval with conditions. Staff recommends approval with the following condition:

The Conditional Use Permit is valid only for the current owner.

Item Details:

The applicant owns a residence at 1214 Western Avenue and would like to operate a hair salon from the home. A hair salon is considered a Major Home Occupation, which is reviewed through the Conditional Use Permit process using the standards found on the major home occupation checklist. Home hair salons are allowed as a major home occupation only as single chair operation.

The location, 1214 Western Avenue, is a single-family residence in the Residence R-1A Single-Family District. The applicant is proposing to build an addition to the home which could be used as a salon or extra room if not approved for the home occupation use. The addition will meet all required setbacks and would be considered an ordinary improvement to a single-family home.

The property includes sufficient parking for a home occupation. Two spaces are required for the home occupation, in addition to the required two spaces for a single-family home.
