IT WORKS!

History

- 1980's number of drug arrests skyrocketed as result of crack cocaine epidemic leading to increased proportion of drug offenders in jails and prisons
- Trend continued in 1990's drug offenders accounted for 20% of total growth of state prison populations
- National Drug Intelligence Center predicts cocaine to continue to be a leading threat to the US and for domestic methamphetamine production to increase
- Mexican and Asian DTOs are expected to increase operations in US

Impact

- Drug abuse affects many facets of society:
 - ► Family
 - ▶ Community
 - ▶ Health
 - ▶ Environment
 - ▶ Crime
 - ► Economy

The Answer

- Miami, Dade County, Florida created first Drug Court in 1989
- Became model for all other states
- ▶ 3 primary goals:
 - Reduce Recidivism
 - Reduce Substance Abuse Among Participants
 - Rehabilitate Participants

What is Drug Court?

- Court-managed
- Alcohol/drug intervention treatment program
- Provide cost-effective alternative to traditional criminal case processing
- Voluntary
- Includes regular appearances before Drug Court Judge
- Frequent and random drug testing
- Substance abuse counseling in individual and group settings
- Mental health counseling
- Educational classes
- System of behavior modification based on incentives and sanctions
- Intense community supervision by Drug Court Team
- Can be successfully completed within 18 months to 2 years

The Traditional Model

- BUSTED Arrested and jailed
- Court appearance
- Bond
- Attorney assigned
- Preliminary Hearing or Grand Jury
- Arraignment
- Pre-trial motions and hearings
- Trial
- Pre-sentence
- Sentence -> incarceration or probation

FAST TRACK ACTION

- Quick entry goal is less than 30 days from arrest to sentencing
 - Legal Screen by State's Attorney
 - Info to Defense Attorney, CSO and Drug Court Coordinator
 - Defendant applies
 - Risk/Needs Assessment by CSO
 - 5. Treatment Needs Assessment by Treatment
 - Staffed by Drug Court Team
 - Determination of Acceptance → Sentenced to Drug Court, or Denial → Traditional Process

Eligibility

- Felony offenders not on parole
- ▶ 18 and older
- Voluntary basis
- Must have less than 7 lifetime DUIs
- High-Risk/High-Needs Offenders
- Excludes present convictions for distribution of controlled substances or marijuana
- Excludes any individual required to register as a sex offender
- Excludes any individual convicted of a violent offense

Brookings County Drug Court

- Mission Statement
 - The mission of the Brookings
 County Drug Court is to enhance
 public safety with the goal of
 developing sober, productive,
 law-abiding citizens by holding
 the offender accountable while
 providing supervision, treatment,
 and life skills in a judicial setting.

What does it take to graduate?

Graduation Requirements:

- Complete Phase 5
- Paid all fees on current file
- 90 days continuous sobriety
- Employed
- Acceptable housing
- In program for at least 18 months

The Team Approach

- Probation
- Chemical Dependency and Mental Health Counselors
- Prosecutor
- Defense Attorney
- Law Enforcement
- Judge
 - Weekly Team update on each participant's completion of requirements
 - Discuss specific problems or concerns

Financial Impact

- Funded by the South Dakota Legislature
 - Includes treatment costs
 - Drug testing costs
 - Defense attorney contract
 - CSO and Coordinator salaries
- Decreased costs to County
 - Less incarceration days in County Jail
 - Decreased court expense
 - Successful, contributing citizens

Update

- Current Participants- 13
- Graduates- 6 Participants
- ► Terminated- 6 Participants
- ▶ 36% Male
- ▶ 64% Female
- Ages:
 - 29% are of 19-30 years of age
 - > 57% are 31-40
 - ▶ 14% are 41 or older
- Drug of Choice
 - ▶ 57% Methamphetamine
 - ▶ 14% Alcohol
 - > 7% Opioids
 - > 7% Marijuana
 - ▶ 15% Other LSD, for example

Update

- Current Participants have 28 children, collectively
- The budget allocated by the state funds salaries, treatment, office supplies, travel and training for State employees
- No State funds are used for incentives, special needs of participants, graduations- nothing extraneous
