## Repeal of No Mow May

#### **Background**



- National campaign advocated by Bee City USA
- <u>Purpose</u>: to support pollinator populations by encouraging residents to delay lawn mowing during the month of May.
- Greatest Impact: increased awareness about pollinators
- Mixed results & unintended challenges:
  - Proliferation of invasive plant species in unmanaged lawns.
  - Negative impacts on neighborhood aesthetics and property values.
  - Increased complaints about overgrown and unsightly lawns.
  - Difficulty in enforcing.

#### **Background**

- brookings south DAKOTA
- Recommendation: Approve the repeal of No Mow May provision of the vegetation management code and focus on alternative strategies.
- By repealing the No Mow May initiative and focusing on alternative strategies, the city will:
  - 1. Restore Lawn Maintenance Standards
  - 2. Invasive Species
  - 3. Promote Alternative Pollinator-Friendly Practices
  - 4. Provide Education and Resources
  - 5. Evaluate Long-Term Strategies





### Closing

- Based on feedback, Sustainability Council believes while wellintentioned, the No Mow May initiative has presented challenges that outweigh its benefits.
- Sustainability Council believes the City should explore other sustainable approaches to pollinator conservation that balance ecological goals with community needs.
