# Programming:

### Kids:

- The fall session of Music and Storytime will be wrapping up the week before Thanksgiving.
- The children's department a very busy last few weeks with a number of special programs.
  - At the end of October, they participated in the Truck or Treat and then the next day hosted their second Costume Spooktacular party.
  - The following week was a puppet show at the beginning of the week and a breakout challenge program on Friday.
