## **Summary and Recommended Action**

The City Council requested a Study Session to inform the public of Initiated Measure 28 (IM 28). This November 5<sup>th</sup> ballot measure prohibits taxes on anything sold for human consumption. There is no recommended action for this item.

#### Item Details:

IM 28 is a measure impacting taxes on consumables. Before the November 5<sup>th</sup> Election, the City Council requested a special Study Session to inform the public about this matter.

There are varying opinions on the fiscal impact on the state and City of Brookings based on the passage of IM 28. This discussion seeks to clarify the intention of the measure and possible outcomes.

The City of Brookings largest source of income is sales tax. Sales tax is approximately 47% of the General Fund revenue and 74% of the Capital Improvement Plan revenue. The South Dakota League of Municipalities identified the potential impact on the City of Brookings at \$1.6 million.
