Electronic Waste Recycling

- **Ordinance 26-003 would add E-Waste and lithium batteries to the list of items that are not accepted for disposal within the Brookings Regional Landfill**
 - **Will be implementing E-waste Recycling Program**
 - **Currently no E-Waste regulations in SD, but many municipalities have programs in place**

Why Recycle E-Waste?

- Save Landfill Airspace
 - ▶ Extends municipal landfill life
 - ▶ *According to the EPA, E-Waste is the fastest growing municipal waste stream in landfills*
- Hazardous Materials
 - ▶ Many components of household electronics are comprised of hazardous materials
- Reduce Landfill Fires
 - ▶ Number one culprit for landfill fires in the US is electronics and lithium batteries in the waste stream
- Sustainability
 - ▶ 98% of components in e-waste devices are recyclable

Operations Plan

- E-Waste collection area at Brookings Regional Landfill.
 - ▶ Waste will be placed in gaylord box
 - ▶ Final price given in office
- Price is a per pound fee of \$1.25/pound
 - ▶ Fee covers disposal, admin, and equipment replacement
- E-Waste will be collected by American Recycling out of Lincoln, NE
