Subject: Ordinance 23-019: 2023 Budget Amendment No. 5

Summary:

City of Brookings staff continually monitors departmental budgets and brings amendments to the City Council as necessary to account for circumstances not anticipated in the originally adopted appropriation ordinance. This ensures compliance with state and local laws and maintains transparency regarding the City's operational and capital needs. This amendment increases budget authority to recognize National Opioid Settlement funds, which will cover a significant portion of the cost of a new Mobile Command Center for the Police Department.

Background:

To date, the City has been awarded \$32,293 in National Opioid Settlement funds. These funds are intended for opioid remediation efforts, and the Police Department has identified the purchase of a mobile command center as an approved use, as it can be utilized to facilitate prescription drug return programs within Brookings County, as well as at nursing centers and elderly residential facilities, and as a resource for centralized opioid training of area first responders. The Police Department will also be able to use the mobile command center for various community events.
