Subject: Progress Report Date: August 2, 2017

The purpose of this memo is to provide the City of Brookings with a progress report highlighting our efforts to develop the Brookings Marketplace project. The report covers the period of time from January, 2017 when the development agreement between the City and Brookings Marketplace, LLC was approved through July 2017. The report is divided into three sections.

Section One: Administrative/Planning/Marketing

It was generally believed that because of the disruption that would be caused by the reconstruction of 6th Street and the I-29 interchange, 2017 would be a year that would be primarily devoted to the formation of the development team, completion of due diligence activities by the members of the Development Team and commencement of marketing efforts. The goal of the Development Team was to position the project in the market so that real interest in the site would begin to materialize in 2018.

To successfully accomplish their initial objectives of developing a site plan, identifying prospects and completing the due diligence work outlined in the development agreement, team leaders established a systematic and focused routine for the group that was intended to insure that the Marketplace moved forward on a systematic basis. The following items were accomplished:

Administrative

- The team leaders finished legal work necessary to put the Operating Agreement for Brookings Marketplace, LLC in place.
- Scheduled regular monthly meetings of the project team. The meetings have been held in either Sioux Falls or Brookings and have allowed team members an opportunity to meet face to face to review progress, discuss problems and establish goals.
- Scheduled regular weekly conference calls between the members of the marketing group.
 The goal of the marketing group has been to systematically identify prospects that would fill

gaps that currently exist in the Brookings retail market and find prospects that might identify Brookings as a logical expansion opportunity in eastern South Dakota.

The marketing group consists of Reggie Kuipers, Bender Commercial Real Estate, Steve Schwanke, Inland Development Partners and Jon Fahning, Shingobee Real Estate. Reggie's focus is on the marketing of the project to local and regional retail prospects while Jon and Steve have focused on larger regional and national prospects.

Had regular contact with city personnel and members of the Brookings Economic
 Development Corporation staff to discuss prospects, project timing, zoning issues and
 environmental concerns. The objective of these meetings was to exchange information and
 make certain that local officials of what was being done to move the Marketplace forward.

Planning

In order to successfully present a vision of the Marketplace project to prospective tenants and the community and to move forward with the due diligence activities outlined in the Development Agreement between the City and Marketplace, LLC, it was necessary to expand the development team to include an architectural design firm capable of capturing the team's vision for the site and an engineering firm knowledgeable of the site as it currently exists and qualified to address the drainage and environmental issues that have been identified on site.

Three architectural firms (Perspective, Inc. Confluence and JLG, Inc.) were invited to submit design proposals and participate in team interviews. After presentations and interviews, Perspective, Inc. was selected to become a member of the development team.

Banner Associates was selected to provide engineering services for the project. Banner is currently revising the ALTA survey for the site, completing analysis of drainage and wetland issues on site and completing preliminary design for the infrastructure that will need to be constructed on site.

Developing the initial site plan for the project was time consuming and intense. Several plans were reviewed and discussed as the Development Team members sought a plan that would attract prospective tenants, maximize the development potential of the site and be consistent with the overall objectives of the City. Site planning was further complicated by the presence of the natural drainage way that runs through the site. Finalizing a site plan that maintained the drainage flow through the site and took advantage of the aesthetic possibilities of the natural area and addressed the requirements of the Corp of Engineers was a complex process.

After reviewing the various environmental reports that had been done during the time the was acquiring the site, legal counsel for Marketplace, LLC recommended that additional work be completed to update the Phase I Environmental report that was completed in 2011, and that further testing be undertaken to determine the extent of any environmental issues that may exist under the concrete slab that remains from the former SDDOT highway maintenance shop and office building. Geotek Testing and Engineering Services, Inc. was retained to complete this work. The updated Phase I has been finished and the development team is working to schedule the testing needed for the former maintenance shop site.

The final planning and development activity initiated during the time period covered in this report is the submission of the rezoning application for the site. The zoning application was submitted to the Community Development Department on July 17th. The application was reviewed and approved by the Planning Commission on August 1st. The zoning application is scheduled to be on the City Council agenda for review and approval August 22nd and September 12th.

Marketing/Community Awareness

Beginning in March, the members of the marketing team began a systematic assessment of the existing Brookings retail environment and an analysis of likely prospects that might have an interest in doing business in Brookings. Existing retail leakage reports, data compiled by the Brookings Economic Development Corporation and the marketing team's knowledge and familiarity with national and regional prospects were instrumental in shaping the initial strategy that evolved for the project. The strategy formed the basis for the presentation that was taken to the ICSC conference in May. A copy of the ICSC marketing package is attached to this report as Tab A.

Three team members (Reggie Kuipers, Steve Schwanke and Jon Fanning) from the Marketplace, LLC attended the ICSC conference in Las Vegas in May. During their time at the conference, marketing team members participated in 12 scheduled calls on potential retail tenants and made 60-70 informal contacts with prospective clients. Team members were also able to participate in various social functions that enabled them to further introduce Brookings to the retail market.

In addition to getting ready for ICSC, development team members also focused on building community awareness and support for the Marketplace. In July (6th and 10th) community meetings were held to introduce the Marketplace to the community and to seek public input. The first meeting was held in cooperation with the East Brookings Business and Industry Council. At the first "open house" style meeting more than 30 attendees were able to review the development plan and offer suggestions and ideas for how to improve the project. The most frequently asked question from attendees was "How soon can you get started with construction?"

The second community meeting, held at City Hall drew over 20 attendees. At both meetings attendees were given an opportunity to complete a short written questionnaire. Attendees were asked four questions:

- o What do you like best about the Marketplace project?
- o Do you have suggestions about how to improve the project?
- o Would you like us to stay in contact with you as the project moves forward?
- Do you have any other thoughts about the Marketplace that you would like to share?

A total of 9 questionnaires were completed. A summary of the responses to the questionnaire is included in Tab B.

Section Two: Significant Results

As stated earlier in the report, because of the rebuilding of 6th Street, 2017 was viewed

by members of the Development Team as a year that would be devoted primarily to planning and marketing. It was generally believed that retailers would not take a serious look at Brookings' potential until street construction was nearing completion and it was possible easily drive to the site. The surprise (pleasant) has been the level of interest that was generated at ICSC and as a result of the contacts (regional/local) that have been made by the marketing team. As of the date of this report, the marking team is actively working with three potential junior box tenants in an effort to secure Letters of Intent. While not binding, a Letter of Intent is the first step toward securing tenants for the Marketplace.

The team also has initial discussions underway with several restaurant prospects and other tenants that could occupy space in one or more strip centers that could be developed in the project.

Section Three: Objectives Moving Forward

Looking forward, marketing will continue to be a priority function of the members of the Development team. During the next six-nine months, team members will also strive to accomplish the following objectives:

August

- o Completion of final environmental reports

September

- o Rezoning approved by the City Council
- o Continue tenant negotiations
- o Secure initial approval of wetlands designation from the Corp of Engineers
- o Preliminary infrastructure improvements budget complete
- o Project proforma complete
- o Submission of Preliminary Tax Increment Financing Plan to the City

October

- o Submission of Tax Increment Financing Plan to the City
- Continued tenant discussions

November

o Continued tenant discussions

December

- o Approval of TIF district by City Council
- o Submission of infrastructure financing/loan application to a local lender(s)

January

- o Preliminary infrastructure loan application approval
- o Infrastructure plan released for contractor bidding

o Third Letter of Intent received

February

- o Infrastructure loan closed
- o Infrastructure bids received

March

o Infrastructure bids approved

April

o Phase I land sale from City to Marketplace LLC

May

o Phase I infrastructure work commences.

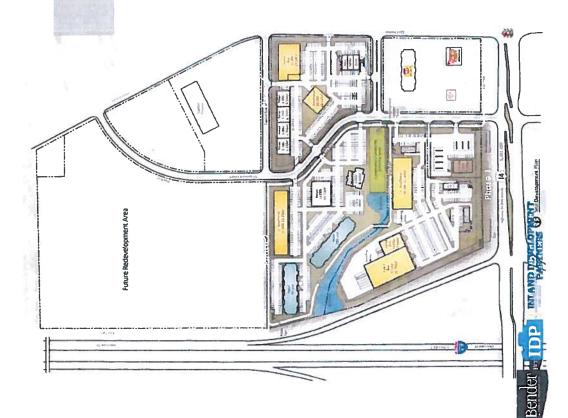

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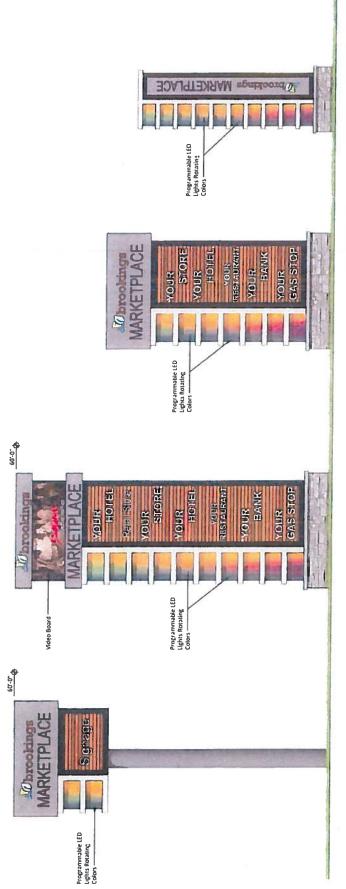

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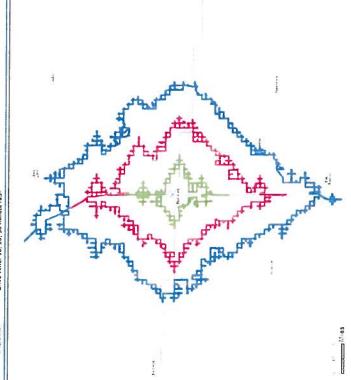
