- Construction 2022 2023



Due to the 2021 drought BMU has need to further restrict the use of water for irrigating lawns in Brookings.

Starting July 19th water used for irrigating lawns will be

limited to every **Monday and Friday** for property with an **even address number** and limited to every **Tuesday and Saturday** for property with an **odd address number**.


