#### 2022 BUDGET

- 2022 Budget total is over \$1 million less than 2021

#### **GENERAL FUND INCREASE**

- \$640k increase from 2021
  - Improving economy from COVID downturn

- Engineering Division
- Street Division
- Solid Waste Division

#### NON-DEPARTMENTAL EXPENDITURES FURTHER REDUCED

- Supported by E-911 Board

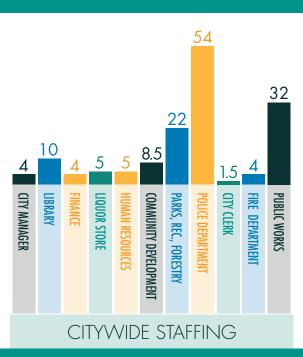
