## **Programming:**

Kids:

- We have constructed a new puppet theater and are excited to use it for the first time on Tuesday, October 19, at 7:00 pm.

## Teens:

- Anime Club is kind of off the charts! So far, our biggest group has been 33 teens!
- Teen Gaming is a new program and off to a great start have had 10-12 teens attend each time
- Teens were excited about Board Games being offered as a new program 6 attended the first night & several have been asking when it would be held again
- Katie was invited to present to ALL 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade Reading classes this year to talk about the programs we will be hosting throughout the school year and do some book talks. That included about 550 teens!! - We also have local artist, Chuck Bennis, scheduled to do an interactive presentation with the teens on 10/25 & talk about how to turn art into a career!
- Teen Screen & Scribble is going over better now than it did in the summer.... We had 10 at the September movie and teens have been making suggestions for future movies!

## Adults:

- Our first post-COVID Escape Room was a success! 113 people participated!
